City Dog Bylaw

The Parkvale Community Association Board was made aware of a few uncontrolled dogs in the neighbourhood and in Barrett Park.

This is a reminder to keep pets under control at all times. This includes leashing and, if necessary, muzzling. Off leash pets must be in an enclosed secured area. Barrett Park is not an off-leash park. Residents should be respectful when using public spaces to minimize unwelcome dog encounters. Any incidents, experienced directly or witnessed, should be reported to Alberta Animal Services (AAS) for action to be taken in accordance of the City Bylaw.

Reporting can be done online at www. albertaanimalservices.ca/bylaw-enforcement/ or by phoning 403-347-2388.

AAS will require the following information when registering a complaint:

- Your name, address, phone number
- Location, date and time of incident
- If known, the current location/address of the animal
- Brief details of the incident, including names and phone numbers of any witnesses
- Animal's breed, size, color and any other identifiable features on the animal
- Address where animal lives

Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. The person's info who reported the incident will be kept confidential.

Orange Ribbon Campaign



Central Alberta is a significant historical landscape of the ancestral territories of the Cree, Blackfoot and Métis people.

It was a place to meet in peace and trade and hold ceremonies. The largest Métis settlement West of Red River was located east of Red Deer. **Truth and Reconciliation** is a process of healing relationships, sharing truths, listening to the knowledge that is being shared, and doing our part to redress past harms.

The City of Red Deer's Orange Ribbon Campaign invites us to participate in a Truth and Reconciliation journey. Orange ribbons are a symbolic gesture to express solidarity with our indigenous community, an expression of grief for Canada and Red Deer's residential school history. The colour orange is recognized as a symbol of the loss of childhood innocence, and disconnection from family. It is also a common practice in Indigenous cultures to tie ribbons to tree trunks as a memorial marker.

Orange ribbons blessed by Knowledge Keepers can be picked up at Collicutt Centre, Recreation Centre, City Hall, and Intermediate School.

Residents are encouraged to tie the ribbons to trees or plants in a place that is meaningful to them. The ribbons are 100% biodegradable and will not harm the growth of a tree.
